Course Description and Objectives

MDES 150 continues elementary Persian I and is designed to further develop your basic Persian language skills in listening, speaking, writing and reading comprehension. This class builds upon a communicative and blended learning approach. Based on the Task-based Language Teaching (TBLT) methodology, students will be engaged in real-life language tasks and do online projects through the Pixton portal to incorporate learned tasks into their interpersonal skills. Other objectives of MDES 150 are to help students to:

• read texts of elementary II level difficulty communicate and converse in Persian and do language tasks on a variety of topics ask and answer the following open-ended questions which is built upon real-life tasks of description, narration, and comparison:

- write simple and accurate sentences and short paragraphs.
- develop cultural awareness through additional readings, movies and class discussions.
