SYLLABUS: BISC 193 FRESHMAN COLLOQUIUM

The Freshman Colloquium is a new one unit course that meets every Tuesday each week throughout the semester in Grace Ford Salvatori Hall from 11 to 11:50am.

The course provides students with insights and a personal introduction to the structure and function of the Department of Biological Sciences that serves to illustrate the research emphasis, objectives and methods of the each of the broad areas of research specialization of the Biological Sciences Department and closely related faculty.

Each faculty member will present their research work through an oral and illustrated presentation to the class followed by a question and answer session during the fifty minute class time.

Students interested in learning more about faculty interests and finding possible laboratory environments in which they may wish to further explore their own research interests during their undergraduate experience may find the course especially useful.
