Plagiarism:

Plagiarism is the use of ideas and/or quotations (from the internet, books, films, television, newspapers, articles, the work of other students, works of art, media, etc.) without proper credit to the author/artist. The program holds to the view that plagiarism constitutes intellectual theft and is a serious breach of acceptable conduct. Any student caught plagiarizing will immediately be given a 'no credit' for the composition. The student will not be allowed to re-write the paper, and if there is further evidence of plagiarism, more severe disciplinary action will be recommended.

Ejercicios/Quizzes/Tareas: Students are expected to complete and correct the textbook exercises that correspond to the grammatical points and readings assigned in class. There will be short quizzes to review this material.

- **Oral Presentations (OP):** Each student will be assigned one oral presentation. For each presentation, students must prepare a handout containing pertinent questions that their classmates will answer during their presentations. Students should not read their presentations. Each presentation should last from 6-8 minutes. If you are interested in using audiovisual aids for your presentation, please provide your own computer. The instructor is not responsible for the technology used during OPs.
 - **Para estudiar en casa (PEC):** These assignments are to be done at home, following the corresponding instructions. These assignments will also be discussed or referred to in class.
 - **Compositions:** Students will receive guidelines for composition writing and for error correction. There will be two compositions. Students will need to revise the first composition thoroughly. The revision will have to be accompanied by the first draft. The final grade of the first composition will be an average of the grades obtained in the two versions submitted. Lack of the first version will result in 50% off the grade for the composition in question. Composition # 2 will have ONE version and no rewrite.
 - **Midterm and Final Exams:** A detailed study guide will be distributed before each exam.
 - **Reading Evaluation Test:** This test evaluates the comprehension of “ Las batallas en el desierto”. Questions will be based on oral presentations and discussions about this short story in class. Please read the text carefully.
 - **Class participation** includes: a) attendance (three unexcused absences will lower the grade), and b) class discussions.
 - **All written assignments must be type-written and spellchecked.** If your word-processing application does not have a Spanish dictionary, you can proof your work on one of the computers in the Language Center.
 - Late homework or assignments will not be accepted without a valid excuse (illness confirmed by doctor's note, death in the family, etc.)
