Exam and Assignment Schedule

Online Quizzes (20%)

PsychPortal is an online learning environment that integrates a complete e-Book version of our textbook, videos, an assignment center, and grading system. To help you stay on track with the course material and to provide you with access to a variety of interactive learning tools, you will be asked to complete 18 PsychPortal quizzes. All quizzes are open-book, untimed, and multiple-choice. Similar to the exams, you will be allowed to drop your TWO lowest quiz scores. Each of the 16 remaining quizzes will thus make up 1.25% of your overall course grade. To accommodate different learning styles, you can take the quizzes at your own pace as long as they are completed by 11:50 p.m. the evening that they are due. For example, you can choose what date/time you take each of the first four quizzes as long as they are all completed by the evening of September 10th. Each student will receive a randomized set of quiz items (so that no two quizzes will necessarily be the same) and students may <u>NOT</u> work together to answer quiz items.
