PSYC 490x: Directed Research in Psychology

Description of PSYC 490x Directed Research:

Psyc 490x allows students to conduct research under faculty direction. The prerequisites are PSYC 100, PSYC 274, and one additional psychology course. A minimum GPA of 3.0 is also required. Students may enroll in 2 - 4 credits in one semester, continuing over multiple semesters, up to a maximum of 8 credits. Note that credits earned through completion of Psyc 490x may not be applied toward the 400-level course requirement for the psychology major. However, Psyc 490x may be applied toward the required, additional psychology course, either upper or lower division, of at least 2.67 units (max 4 units).

To earn credit for PSYC 490x, students must do the following:

- 1. Identify a faculty advisor in psychology and discuss a plan for the directed research experience;
- 2. Submit this proposal form with your faculty advisor's signature (see page 2 of this document);
- 3. Submit, by the last day of final exam period, acceptable responses to the end-of-term questionnaire and a research paper. Page 3 of this document contain the end-of-term submission instructions.

Note that an average of 2-3 hours of involvement per week for each credit enrolled must be described in the proposal and in the end-of-term questionnaire.

How does Psyc 490x differ from Psyc 290x?

They have different prerequisites, and Psyc 490x is generally appropriate for students in their junior or senior year although some sophomores may meet the requirements. Psyc 290x is intended for students with little to no experience in a research lab whereas Psyc 490x is intended for students who have some research experience. Generally, a student will contribute to their 490x faculty mentor's lab on a voluntary basis or while completing Psyc 290x before enrolling in 490x with that faculty member. Some students will design and conduct their own studies while enrolled in 490x. Others will work fairly independently on an ongoing research project in the lab, or prepare a significant literature review under the faculty member's direction.
