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Syllabus

Course Goal: To grow as a contemporary string player and creative artist in a range of classical and contemporary musical genres. To develop contemporary string ensemble/section skills including stylistic interpretation, solo improvisation, rhythm section skills, improvised accompaniment, percussion and other extended string techniques, and use of amplification. Students are encouraged to arrange/compose for the group.

Course Expectations: Students are expected to be present and on time for all rehearsals. Each *unexcused* absence will result in a letter grade deduction from the final semester grade. Students are expected to be prepared for each rehearsal, with measurable weekly progress on one or more of our weekly short-term goals. All students are expected to represent the Thornton School of Music, the Popular Music Department, and the creative string playing community positively and professionally; at all times, both on and off campus.

Course Hours: Thursdays from 5:00 to 6:50pm. Sectionals and additional/makeup rehearsals may be scheduled as needed.

Grade: Your semester grade will be determined by attendance (25%), weekly progress on assigned work (25%), in-class participation/contribution to rehearsal (25%), and concert performance (25%).
