Course Text: James Stewart, Essential Calculus, Second Edition, ISBN: 9781133112297.

**Course Description**: Limits, continuity, derivatives and applications, antiderivatives, integral of a function, the fundamental theorem of calculus, exponential and logarithmic functions.

**Learning Objectives and Outcomes**: By the end of the semester you will be familiar with the basic concepts and methods of the theory of a function of a single variable. Undoubtedly, the key result this semester will be the fundamental theorem of calculus which relates the integral of a continuous function to the antiderivative of this function. We will also explore some applications of early calculus to physics.

**Prerequisite(s)**: Math 108 - Contemporary Precalculus.

**Grading breakdown**: Your performance in the course is assessed via a mixture of homework, quizzes, midterm exams, and a final exam, broken down as follows.

- **Homework** (worth 10%): Hand-written homework will be assigned every week, on Monday, and posted on Blackboard. Homework will be due at the beginning of class on the following Monday. For example,
  - Homework 1 is made available on Mon Sep 2nd (through Blackboard) and is due at 1pm in class on Mon Sep 9th.

Late or electronically submitted homework will not be accepted. A selection of the homework problems will be graded with feedback. However all problems should be seriously attempted and your level of attempt will be part of the grading rubric. Your lowest homework grade will be dropped.

Your homework will be judged not only on the validity of the proposed solution but also on the quality of the exposition. Your solutions should be well thought out and communicated concisely, with appropriately chosen notation. It is permitted, and encouraged, to collaborate on homework assignments. **However** each student must write their solution on their own and in their own words. Identical, or highly similar solutions, will not be tolerated. This will be considered as plagiarism, a very serious offense to USC's Code of Conduct.

- Quizzes (worth 13%): There will be a weekly 20 min quiz during Tuesday's discussion every week of the semester, but midterm weeks. No make-ups under any circumstances. Your lowest quiz grade will be dropped.
- Midterm Exams (worth 21% each): Two in-class midterm exams are tentatively scheduled for:
  - Wednesday, October 2nd, from 1:00pm 1:50pm, in VKC 100,
  - Wednesday, November 6th, from 1:00pm 1:50pm, in VKC 100.
- Final Exam (worth 35%): The final exam has been scheduled by the University for:
