Course Description

The purpose of this one semester (Fall 2020) course is to

- 1]. Establish and certify basic levels of musical competency.
- 2]. Lay a foundation upon which the student can increase their understanding of rhythm, promoting a mastery of physical coordination at the drumset.
- 3]. Provide assigned listening and viewing materials with written response papers being mandatory.
- 4]. Improve sight reading skills
- 5]. Work on TOUCH and TONE.
- 6]. Free up each student's improvisational, i.e., compositional skills on their instrument.
- 7]. FIND YOUR VOICE

The unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic means that students may not be able to utilize the drumsets in the practice rooms in The Music Complex. This necessitates an adaptation on all our parts. GOOD NEWS: THIS IS WHAT DRUMMERS DO ... we adapt! So, the goal of this course will be to focus on the role of the drums in modern American music, also and more appropriately known as Black American music.

I will work with each of you to best maximize your equipment on-hand. Please note the mandatory instrument requirements and advise me ASAP/STAT if you will require assistance in terms of having the proper instruments made available for you ... this also applies to the necessary internet connectivity. The School of Music has pledged to assist ALL STUDENTS to ensure that we're all on the same page if not wavelength in terms of appropriate data transmissions, etc.

Students are expected to have a drumset available in their living environment. If this is problematic or impossible, the school may be able to provide access to a drumset in one or more of the planned "lesson broadcast studios," in which case myself along with Music Operations will work with the students to coordinate class and broadcast room access times, etc. IF the university allows student presence on campus property ... much of this rests with the county and state health authorities. Depending on where the students are located, the school might otherwise be able to provide a basic drumset or reasonable facsimile for both practice and lesson activities. Please rest assured that you will be taught to the best of my imagination and abilities. Much of what we'll do will require no more than a ride cymbal, snare (or pad) and hi-hat with bass drum pad, too! All to say: we'll figure and work things out ... the situation is fluid at the moment, thank you for your understanding and patience. The most important thing is for everyone to stay healthy.

Netiquette Considerations

"Netiquette" or "internet etiquette," describes the recommended communication and behavior of online communication. Students are expected to be dressed appropriately for class. Class time is not snack time. You'll do your best work by approaching the course as if you were taking it in-person/on-campus. Simply put: the study of music is, in great measure, the study of being professional.

Please consult this <u>Menu of Discussion Norms</u> resource for guidance on how best to receive instruction, interact constructively and enjoyably get the most out of your study of drumming.

Also note: the use of mobile phones or other technology during your lesson is not allowed, unless you are using that device for a specific lesson-related purpose. In other words: no text, email or Instagram checking while I'm teaching you.

Grading Criteria:

- Attendance: Attendance is expected for all lessons. This studio will allow one unexcused absence per semester. Each additional unexcused absence will result in a 5% reduction of your overall grade. If a student is 10 minutes or more late for their lesson, that lesson is forfeit and will **not** be rescheduled.
- Lesson Attentiveness (20%): in addition to punctuality, the art and discipline of paying attention will be factored into each student's grading.
- Listening +/or Reading Assignments (20%): Students will be sent files or download links for assigned listening or reading. All assigned listening or reading will involve and require response papers to be submitted at least 24 hours prior to the next-scheduled lesson (due papers submitted the morning of a lesson will not be accepted).
- Weekly Homework Assignments (40%): Students will be expected to complete all homework assignments. Part of the homework regimen will include listening to and transcribing specific recorded performances.
- **Final Jury Performance (20%):** Students will perform in a jury-type setting for the Instructor. These may be pre-recorded per the discretion and prior agreement/understanding of Professor Erskine.

- -Practicing: Students are expected to practice a minimum of 6 hours per week outside of lesson time.
- -Grade levels: while I will be instructing students whose grade-levels range from Freshman to Post-Grad, the essential contours and musical concerns will remain consistently similar throughout the course of studies. Week-to-week playing challenges will offer opportunities for variation, as well as each student's mastery of the basics, etc. This studio also encourages students to ask for specific guidance during each lesson. From Week #2 on, homework assignments will be individualized.

Grading and Exams

- Aural and Written Mid-term examination (25%) Examination of aural and written materials pertaining to drumming styles and history presented in the first 7 weeks of class.
- **Drumming Skills Exam #1 (25%)** Students must demonstrate a mastery of basic drumming skills on the practice pad as well as drumset "time" playing, i.e., beats that involve the steadiness of tempo and a measure of drumbeat competency.
- Final Exam/Drumming Skills Exam #2 (50%) All students will perform in a jury type of setting for the Instructor. They may be asked to play basic drum rudiments on the practice pad, as well as a beat in any of the styles, tempos that have been studied throughout the semester on the drumset. Drumset chart reading will also be part of the final examination.
