Course Description

Expanding on the concepts and skills introduced in DES 332a Typography, DES 332b Advanced Typography is devoted to the further study of typography and type's application. Students will explore the dynamics of type in multiple contexts and through the use of various media.

Coursework includes lectures, exercises, hands-on projects, in-class discussions, critiques, readings, and studio projects.

Learning Objectives

Students further investigate the systems, models and mechanics of the past before they are introduced to modern typeface design software. Intensive research will culminate in the design of a traditional sans serif typeface (or at least the first steps in this process) and more expressive experimental typographic design. Students will also develop complex editorial designs and deal with issues like how best to represent time, sequence, scale, etc.

Prerequisite(s): Typography 1 (DES 332a)
