#### **Course Description**

This is a large ensemble, performing contemporary original works for big band/jazz orchestra, as well as occasionally some works from the historical big band repertoire. CJO meets for rehearsals twice weekly, preparing for two concerts during the Spring 2022 semester: Monday, February 14 at 8pm (CTV), and Monday, April 4 at 9pm (CTV).

#### Communication

Majority of the work will be done in class during ensemble rehearsals. Occasional outside listening will be assigned. Individual practice of music outside of rehearsals is expected, as much as needed to be prepared for full ensemble meetings.
