 - Your name, the Class you are registered in (CHE 550A, CHE 550B, or MASC 598), Title of Seminar, Name of the speaker, Abstract (in your words, do not cut and paste from the speaker's abstract), Introduction, Methodology, Key results, Conclusions (including your assessment).
