**Location and meeting times:** We will be meeting on average 1.5 academic hours per week. The meetings in January and February will be on zoom. In March and April you'd attend two week long workshops at IPAM (can be watched online as well) and we will have discussions based on the talks you'll see.

Course description. This seminar course will cover topics at the intersection of asymptotics, statistical mechanics and algebraic combinatorics. It will be associated with the IPAM long program "Geometry, Statistical Mechanics and Integrability" and students are expected to attend talks during the first two program workshops (registration fees will be waived for students registered for this class). Possible topics to be covered during the seminar meetings: longest increasing subsequences of permutations and the Tracy-Widom distribution of eigenvalues of random matrices; asymptotics of standard Young tableaux; 6-vertex model and alternating sign matrices; lozenge tilings and plane partitions; asymptotics of structure constants. Students will be expected to give a short presentation on a recent research paper.
