Here is our reading list:

Susan Holbrook. *How to Read & Write about Poetry.* (Required)—this is our 'textbook' which will help us with history and terminology, etc.

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- Lucille Clifton. How to Carry Water: Selected Poems of Lucille Clifton. (Required)—a selected greatest hits volume by a great American poet of the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century (twice a finalist for the Pulitzer in the 1980s/90s)
- Amorak Huey. *Dad Jokes from Late in the Patriarchy*. (Required)—wonderful volume about family, parenthood, and pop culture
- Natasha Trethewey. Monument. (Required)—selected poems from the Pulitzer Prize winning poet and memoirst, former US Poet Laureate (poems from 1999-2019)
- Two volumes by the poet Kate Daniels, NIOBE POEMS (1988) and IN THE MONTHS OF MY SON'S RECOVERY (2019)—both are available online through USC libraries in ebooks; the first is a family memoir in poetry about the drowning of a child and its aftermath; the second is a very candid poetic rendition of the poet's journey (as a mother, a wife, and a woman in her 60s) through her son's opiod addiction and recovery in the past decade.
