COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Occupational Science Minor Program examines the science of everyday living, with courses like "Disability, Occupation, and Health Care" focusing on activity and participation from the perspectives of people with disabilities. Students will explore the varied experiences of living with a disability, including barriers, supports, and the impact of health care policies, through first-person narratives and the stories of disability rights advocates. The course critically examines disability labels, introduces models such as the medical, social, and minority models, and incorporates current events and media portrayals to deepen understanding. Learning methods include problem-based learning, videos, guest speakers, presentations, and discussions, fostering a comprehensive exploration of disability, occupation, and health care.
